

Senior Nutrition – Home Delivered Meals



Funding vs. Population Change



The Hard Truth

- Waiting lists are the highest in our 50+ years of providing services.
- Clients are waiting over 1 year to receive services.
- Our FY24-25 increase was only **\$8,012** to split between 3 agencies.
- Older adult population is growing at unprecedented rates not tapering off.
- Minimal increases in funding + inflation = reduction in services.

**Significant funding increases are needed
to meet rapidly growing demand.**
